The third session of the conference was led by Rocky and our prophetic team joined by the worship team of Allyster Taubeneck and Zach Lowrie. We were excited to introduce the element of worship mixed with prayer for the intercession time.

SHALOM FESTIVAL

On May 24 2014, a man walked into the Jewish Museum of Brussels and shot four people. He disappeared without any witnesses. Cameras caught his silhouette on camera but could not provide a great deal of facial recognition. We made a call to prayer. This was the backdrop to the Shalom festival that took place again this year. The festival is a public celebration of Christians and Jews in Brussels which promotes our agreement to stand with one another. With the assassin still at large, the police asked us to cancel our event scheduled to place a few blocks from the Grand Place. Both sides decided to proceed. Thankfully, the day before our event, the killer was caught in Marseille France. It was a random search. He had the guns plus a video of himself telling others what he would do. This is a miracle from God.

The Shalom Festival went on as scheduled on Sunday. The churches came out to stand with our Jewish Community. It was a great show of support and it made the news as a top story!!! The newspapers and TV reporters were there

to interview our national leaders, who were able to tell the country how important it is that we support Israel at this time. As European Jewish Congress President Moshe Kantor said, "Attacks on Jewish targets in Europe do not exist in a vacuum, but are part and parcel of an overall climate of hate and incitement against Jewish communities."
